Dear Music Educator,

As we prepare to begin the 2021-2022 school year, NYSSMA recognizes the need for guidance concerning safe and effective music instruction. Given the lack of directives provided by the New York State Health Department and the less-than-complete guidance document published by the New York State Education Department, your professional organization is here to guide and advocate with you, your school, and district leadership, to create the most effective teaching and learning environment in your music classroom.

We encourage you, and your district, to apply the same social distancing and masking guidelines to your music instruction that are being used for the other standards-based subject classrooms in your school. This recommendation is based upon the timely research study findings and recommendations published by the National Federation of High Schools (<u>https://www.nfhs.org/articles/return-to-music-resources-helping-teachers-administrators-students/</u>) and provided by our National Association for Music Education (<u>https://nafme.org/my-classroom/nafme-and-nfhs-return-to-music-guidance-phase-iii-august-2021/</u>).

Please note that the vast majority of music instruction that takes place in schools is curricular, standards-based, and part of a well-rounded education, as per the federal Every Student Succeeds Act and New York State education regulations. Contrary to the NYSED Health and Safety Guide for the 2021-2022 School Year
